In Philadelphia, I have actually seen more flooded basements at 2 a.m. Than at any reasonable hour of the workday. Old real estate stock, narrow rowhomes, shared sewer lines, and winter season temperature swings all make plumbing here a little bit more unforgiving than in many other cities.
