

Fairport NY Weather Overview

Fairport, NY is a small village in Monroe County within the Rochester metropolitan area, and its local climate is shaped by the same broad weather systems that move across western New York. Fairport sits in the Great Lakes region, where a humid continental climate brings four distinct seasons, noticeable humidity in summer, and cold, snow-prone winters.
