- the type of building, such as a **condo**, **townhouse**, or **apartment building**
- limited access in a **multi-unit building**
- the amount of **prep work** required before treatment
- requirements for tenant coordination in rental units
- whether there are already signs of spread to neighbouring units
- how much **monitoring** is needed after the initial service
