

When a home or business needs fresh access after a move, turnover, or lost keys, rekeying often makes more sense than a full lock change. That approach is often faster than replacing every lock, especially when the hardware is still in decent condition.

When a lock change is the wrong move

For many properties, that gives a cleaner security reset without the expense of replacing every lock on the door. The service is also common when several doors need to work with one key again, which can be a real convenience in homes and small offices. A rekey is a better fit when the lock works but the key control has changed.

When rekeying is better than replacement
