Oil drips, rust marks, leaf tannins, and fertilizer stains can add another layer of discoloration.

It removes embedded grime from the pores and texture of the paver material, lifts organic growth, and clears the joint lines where debris collects. In some cases, the work ends with resanding and sealing, especially if the joints have been depleted or the homeowner wants longer-lasting protection.

That last point is worth paying attention to. Cleaning without considering the condition of the joints can create a short-lived result. If the sand between the pavers is missing or compromised, weeds return quickly and the surface can become less stable. If the pavers are left unsealed after years of exposure, stains may return more readily and the color can continue to fade unevenly.
