4. **The Crypto Pivot:** Following Valve's technical restrictions, many CS: GO casinos pivoted to accepting cryptocurrencies (Bitcoin, Ethereum, GBPT) along with skins, running in legal grey areas under overseas licenses (such as Curacao).
